PLAYGROUP

HEAD LICE

Head lice eradication is most effective if the WHOLE school community works together to treat infestations.

Head lice have recently been found in children's hair at school. Please check your children's hair – remember anyone can catch head lice. Check your child's hair in bright light. Check the scalp, especially at the front, nape of the neck, behind the ears, under the fringe and at the base of plaits or a ponytail.

If you do find headlice or nits, commence treatment immediately and be sure to complete the process of treatment. This will help prevent head lice from spreading.

Remember to keep checking your family member's head every 2 days until there are no head lice found for 10 consecutive days.

QUEENSLAND ROAD RULES - E-SCOOTERS & E-BIKES

The health, safety and wellbeing of our students, staff and school community is of the highest priority.

This is a important message to remind students, staff and the community to take care when travelling to and from school.

All types of travel have inherent risks. Regardless of how any of us travel, it's important we are mindful of the potential risks and manage them to avoid incidents and injuries.

With the increasing use of rideables such as electric scooters, skateboards and bikes, ensuring the safety of staff, students and pedestrians is essential.

Please note that <u>Queensland Road Rules</u> apply to e-scooters and e-bikes.

Anyone who scoots, rides or skates to and from school should:

Wear protective gear and a helmet, which is mandatory if riding an <u>electric</u> scooter or skateboard

Give way by ringing your bell when approaching pedestrians and overtaking of the right

Travel at the appropriate and safe speed for the environment in which you are travelling

Be respectful to pedestrians and other path users and keep out of their way Adhere to road rules when riding an e-scooter

Park responsibly to avoid becoming an obstacle or risk for others.
